To apply for **Emergency HEAP** you must apply at the HEAP certifier office and then take the application to Albany County Department of Social Services located at 162 Washington Avenue, Albany.

Please bring the following documentation to the interview with you:

INCOME

Proof of all household income, earned or unearned, including but not limited to:

- ◆ Pay stubs for 4 most recent weeks
- ◆ If self-employed, or have rental income, business records for the most recent 3 months
- ◆ Child support or alimony checks
- ◆ Bankbook/dividend or interest statement
- ◆ Statement from roomer/boarder
- ◆ Verification of Unemployment Insurance Benefits
- ◆ Copy of most recent check or award letter for Social Security / Supplemental Security Income
- ◆ Veteran's Benefits
- ◆ Pensions
- ◆ Worker's Compensation / Disability
- ◆ Educational Grants / Loans

ADDRESS

- ◆ Current rent receipt with name and address
- ◆ Copy of lease with address
- ◆ Mortgage payment books / receipts with address
- ◆ Water, sewage or tax bill
- ◆ Homeowner's insurance policy
- ◆ Deed

HOUSEHOLD COMPOSITION

- ◆ Social Security Card for all Applicants

VULNERABILITY

Age – under 6 years/60 or older

- ◆ Birth Certificate
- ◆ Baptismal Certificate with date of birth
- ◆ Passport
- ◆ Driver's License

Disabled

- ◆ Award Letter
- ◆ Copy of Benefit Check
- ◆ Written Statement of Eligibility for Benefits

FUEL/UTILITY BILL

- ◆ If you pay a fuel or utility bill, bring a copy of your most recent fuel / utility bill
- ◆ If you pay for neither heat nor utilities, bring a statement from your landlord that indicates that heat and utilities are included in your rent
- ◆ If you have a utility emergency, bring your utility termination notice

RESOURCES

(For emergency applications only)

- ◆ Statement claiming zero resources
- ◆ Bank statement showing current balance for checking, savings, and credit union accounts, IRAs, etc.
- ◆ Verification of stocks, bonds, dividends
